<u>Maths</u>

Addition and subtraction sums to 10 and 20. Practise a set of number bonds (pairs of numbers that make 10) try testing daily – do the children get quicker / get more correct? Use hands, fingers, toes. Find numbers around the house. Check out https://www.monstermaths.co.uk/ this is similar to the spelling activities and also has an app. Maths is all around and easy to talk about – what time do you get up? How many pieces of toast for breakfast? Who is the tallest / shortest in the family?

We have been learning about measure in class too. Can you measure household items using your hands, ruler, tape measure, toy bricks? Try cooking and making and measure ingredients carefully. We would love to see some of your delicious efforts on Google Calendar. Don't forget to practise writing numbers too — can your child write to ten or twenty independently and form each number correctly?

History/Geography

We have been learning about pirates – find out about famous pirates. Did pirates come to Jersey? Make treasure maps and design pirate equipment. Talk about the parish you live in can the children recognise landmarks? Do they know of other parishes they visit? What makes Jersey so special?

<u>Science</u>

Look after your sunflower.
